## **CONSTITUTION**

1. The Association shall be known as the **Jersey Freshwater Angling Association.**
2. The objects of the Association are :-
  - (a) To promote freshwater angling in Jersey
  - (b) To keep Association waters in a clean and natural state, thereby enabling the Association members to enjoy to the full the skill and art of freshwater angling.
3.
  - (a) A full member shall be a person whose application has been approved by the Committee and has paid the appropriate entry and subscription fees.
  - (b) Junior membership will be issued to any person under the age of 17 years, whose application has been approved by the Committee and has paid the appropriate entry and subscription fees.
  - (c) Non resident membership will be issued to any person not resident in the Island of Jersey, at a reduced subscription fee, whose application has been approved by the Committee and has paid the appropriate entry and subscription fees.
  - (d) Honorary membership may, on the recommendation of the Committee and at the discretion of an A.G.M.

be conferred on a person or persons, who have rendered outstanding service to the Association or who are from time to time landowners and owners of waters used by the Association.

- (e) Daily or Weekly Permits may be offered to Non Members, on specified venues, at a price agreed by the Committee
- 4. Entrance Fees and Subscriptions for all categories of Membership shall be fixed at the Annual General Meeting, except for Trout Permit prices which are agreed separately with Jersey Water.
- 5. All annual subscriptions must be paid before the 1<sup>st</sup> April each year. The Annual General meeting shall take place before the end of March, when the General Committee shall present its General Report and detailed Balance Sheet, duly audited, made up to the last day of December. Notification of the Annual General meeting shall be at least 14 days clear, prior to the meeting. **Fifteen** members to form a quorum from the meeting from 2010 onwards.
- 6. Any person who has not paid his / her subscription before 1<sup>st</sup> April each year ceases to be a Member. Persons erased from the Membership list may be re-elected upon re-application as a new Member.
- 7. The business of the Association shall be conducted by a General Committee as follows:- Chairman of the Committee, Treasurer, Secretary, Membership Secretary, Competition Secretary, Officer for Junior Affairs, Officer

for Maintenance of Waters, Press Officer and Officer for Fishery Management. Also three other Full Members at least one of whom shall represent the Trout Section.

8. The officials retire annually and are entitled to offer themselves for re-election, unless they fail to attend 60% of the General Committee Meetings.
9. No member may be elected to office in his absence from the Annual General Meeting unless he has submitted in writing, his permission to be considered for election.
10. The General Committee shall have the power to appoint sub-committees and define their duties.
11. The General Committee shall have the power to co-opt.
12. In the event of a member of the General Committee resigning during the year, the General Committee shall be empowered to fill the vacancy thus caused. At all General Committee Meetings, *five* shall form a quorum.
13. The General Committee shall be empowered to call any outside authority to act as technical adviser should any such circumstances arise.
14. All accounts above the sum of £10 shall be paid by cheque signed by any two from four members of the committee duly authorised to sign, not to include the Treasurer.
15. A special meeting shall be called :-

- a. By order of the General Committee;
  - b. By order of the President / Chairman;
  - c. On a requisition signed by not less than six Full Members, stating the subject for which the meeting is to be convened. The stated subject *only* to be discussed.
16. All Members must hold the Association's Membership Card and Rules and must conform to the rules. The card (which is not transferable) must be carried by all Members on all angling excursions and must contain the receipt for the current year's subscription. Current membership stickers must also be displayed at all times.
17. The General Committee shall have the powers to suspend or ban any member guilty of breaking the rules or behaving in a manner detrimental to the Association.
18. Any Member being desirous of any alterations or additions to existing rules, shall send his notice of motion, together with the name of the Seconder, to the Hon. Secretary fourteen days before the Annual General Meeting.
19. The General Committee shall have the power :
- a. To decide on all matters not provided for in these rules;  
and
  - b. To make and to amend the Angling Rules when this is deemed to be in the interests of the Association.

20. The General Committee's decision on the interpretation of these rules shall be binding.
21. It is not considered ethical for members to sell game fish they have caught; any member found doing so will be required to explain their actions to the committee who may take further action.

## **SPECIMEN AND RECORD FISH REGISTRATION OF CATCHES SPECIMEN FISH**

Specimen fish must be witnessed by another member (who must be a senior if the captor is a junior) and confirmed in writing to the General Committee.

## **GENERAL ANGLING RULES**

**These Rules apply to all waters unless varied by a specific rule listed under the relevant water.**

1. All Association Members shall have a right to challenge any other angler found on Association Waters for their permit and/or behaviour.
2. The Association shall recognise a General Close Season for all coarse and game fishing, namely :-

**Coarse Fish:** - 1st April to 31<sup>st</sup> May inclusive

Coarse fishing will be allowed during the close season on the Les Mielles Complex.

**Game :** October to April inclusive. The exact dates will be announced each season.

**Juniors** must be accompanied by a fully paid up senior member except at St Catherine's or Millbrook reservoirs

3. The lighting of fires or barbeques on any association water is strictly prohibited.
4. It is not permitted to take dogs or other animals onto or in the vicinity of the waters except ` in accordance with a Jersey Water General Public rule which is reservoir specific and subject to public notice.

5. Feeding of Ducks and other bird life is not allowed.
6. The leaving of litter / fishing line etc., is not allowed.
7. Membership cards are not transferable and no one can fish for another person
8. It is strictly forbidden to urinate or defecate on the banks or within the boundaries of any reservoir and anglers are to use the toilet facilities where provided
9. Anglers fish entirely at their own risk and must take every precaution for their own safety
10. No member to cut and remove weed from the water other than Association organised working parties
11. No member to remove/cut or prune trees/shrubs or bushes in any way other than Association organised working parties.No member to dig or remove banks for any reason
12. Members found to have bodily entered any water may be required to explain and will be accountable for their actions to the Committee
13. No member will interfere or modify any association construction for whatever reason. In the event that any such construction requires remedial work the association will arrange for the work to be carried out .Members using all such constructions do so at their own risk.

14. Where the Rule book is silent, the Committee reserves the right to call the individual to account for their actions which could result in the permit of the member being revoked
15. The loss of any permit is to be notified as soon as practicable to the Membership Secretary.
16. Where these rules are silent, the General Committee's discretion shall be final and binding .
17. All fish to be returned to the water, no exceptions. Any member found in breach of this rule will, be banned.
18. No tree climbing for any reason and due to the depth of water and steepness of the banks there is no wading above the knee at any time.
19. No dogs, on leads or otherwise

The Associations Bailiffs, have been instructed to be proactive on these rules. And will report to the Committee, any member found in breach of these and any other club rules.

## COARSE FISH ANGLING RULES

20. All persons fishing will have regard to best practice for fish welfare and when any dispute arises the views of the Committee are those to be followed.
21. All coarse fish must be handled with care and returned to the water. Keep-nets must be a minimum of 8ft long by 15 ins. Diameter.
22. All nets to be made of knotless material.
23. No weight is to be placed within keep nets. The recommended practice is to tie an external weight to the outside of the bottom of the net.
24. All fish to be handled with care with wetted hands and not towelling, clothing etc.
25. The use of live fish or amphibians as bait is not permissible.
26. Only the fish taken from Association waters will be considered for Club record and specimen lists.
27. No tins or bottles to be taken on the bank and all members to keep banks clean and tidy and refrain from interfering with livestock or the agricultural amenities of the water or the land adjacent to it. Members must use the recognised parking areas at the various fishing venues.
28. Senior members may use **TWO** rods at the same time provided that this does not interfere with or inconvenience

other anglers and are attended at times. One hook to any line except when spinning or plugging.

Junior members may upon application to a nominated member of the Committee be granted permission for the use of two rods.

29. Where it can be observed the distance between anglers shall be a minimum of 25 ft.
30. Radios, tape or compact disc players will not be used within audible range of any fishing water.
31. No transference of fish to different waters is allowed by Members without permission of the General Committee.
32. All lead weights are banned from Association Waters from size No.6 to swan shot, inclusive of all Ledger weights.
33. Tackle considered detrimental and harmful to fish must not be used.
34. Members using bite alarms must ensure that the volume is set as low as possible.

### **35. CARP ANGLING RULES**

The following rules are for all carp fishing activities and are in addition to the General Angling & Coarse Fish Angling Rules.

Two rods are permitted on all waters except for St Ouens Pond and Grand Vaux where three rods are

allowed subject to obtaining an additional rod permit from the Membership Secretary at a cost of £10. The additional rod must not be used if impairing other anglers.

Line must be a minimum of diameter 0.35mm 15lb/16lb (7kg) when carp fishing and a minimum of 0.25mm 8lb (3.6kg) when surface fishing.

Braided mainlines are not allowed for fishing. The use of braided line for spodding or marker floats is acceptable.

No fixed lead, death rigs, tether or bent hook rigs are allowed – these will be checked! Rigs must allow fish to free themselves from the lead in the event of breakage. Please use safe rigs making sure that the lead set-up can slide over any shock leader knot.

Unhooking mats must be used and wetted before use.

Anglers actively pursuing large fish will be expected to have the appropriate equipment, namely a large knotless net of at least 36 inch minimum, an unhooking mat etc, to safeguard the welfare of the fish.

Baitboats are allowed on all waters except St Ouens Pond, but must be used sensibly and only used in what can reasonably be described as the anglers swim.

Quiet must be observed, while visiting our carp waters and therefore audible electronic bite alarms are to be set

low or silent especially if households are close by. Lights at night are to be kept to a minimum.

All carp are to be returned to the water immediately after capture and are not to be retained in keep-nets or carp sacks unless waiting weighing as a specimen or record fish, or in matches.

Under no circumstances are rods to be left unattended. This includes anglers with remote alarms.

**36. Additional Rules, St. Ouens Pond.**

- (a) Members are reminded that this is a bird sanctuary and must keep to the board walk at all times, and refrain from interfering with birds' nests.
- (b) Between 1<sup>st</sup> June and 31<sup>st</sup> July access along the boardwalks will only be permitted between 2000 hours and 0600 hours. Anglers may remain on the platforms outside of these hours.
- (c) Angling to be from fishing stages only
- (d) Angling from a boat on the Pond is Strictly Forbidden.
- (e) Remote controlled boats or similar devices used to drop off baits or feed are forbidden.
- (f) A maximum of 3 kilos of cereal based ground bait may be used by each angler per day.
- (g) Extreme quiet must be exercised at all times in the Pond area.
- (h) Any breaking of these rules will automatically carry expulsion from the association

This venue may be subject to separate rules issued by the National Trust.

Note: - We are able to fish the pond due to the goodwill of the National Trust and any abuse of the above rules will result in the loss, to the Association, of this fishing venue.

### **37. Additional Rules, South Canal and Les Mielles Golf Course Ponds**

- (a) Fishing is only allowed from the fishing platforms and designated fishing positions. Members using Bivvy style shelters on this water must ensure they do not encroach or otherwise interfere with the golf course. Shelters shall be no further than 2 meters from the stages. Members are reminded that angling is from official stages only and nowhere else
- (b) No fly fishing allowed.
- (c) No boats allowed.
- (d) No cutting or pruning of the reeds and other vegetation is allowed other than in the direct vicinity of the designated fishing position.
- (e) It is not permitted to take vehicles onto the course. Parking is allowed in the Les Mielles Country Club Car Park only.
- (f) The Permit Holder should avoid interference with the game of golf. Please show courtesy to golfers at all times.
- (g) Membership cards are not transferable and must be carried when on the course and produced on request of the Golf Course owners, staff and other Club Members.

- (h) Permission to fish may be cancelled by the Golf Club or at the request of the owners, if the holder conducts a himself in manner detrimental to the Club or owner
- (i) Shirts must be worn at all times.
- (j) Anglers fishing at the venue do so at their own risk.

**38. Angling Rules, Millbrook Reservoir  
(Waterworks Valley)**

- (a) It is strictly forbidden to urinate or defecate on the banks or within the boundaries of the reservoir. Toilets are provided at the reservoir for members to use. Please acquaint yourself with their location.
- (b) Walking or fishing on walls and the Dam is forbidden.
- (c) Loose feeding maggots, pinkies, squats, castors and worms are allowed to a maximum of 2 pints in total per angler per day. Loose feeding particle baits are allowed to a maximum of  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint or 400 grams of boilies in total per angler per day.
- (d) Ground baiting is allowed to a maximum of 3 kilo bag per angler per day.
- (e) Bait binders, namely Stickymag, Grey Leam and Damp Leam is allowed to a maximum of  $\frac{1}{2}$  kilo per angler per day.
- (f) Members are requested to park in the car park or in the road adjacent to it. Access to the reservoir is through the style at the car park end, or the gate on the main road. Do not climb over the fence.

**39. Additional Rules, Dannemarche Reservoir  
(Waterworks Valley)**

- (a) It is strictly forbidden to urinate or defecate on the banks or within the boundaries of the reservoir. Toilets are provided at the reservoir for members to use. Please acquaint yourself with their location.
- (b) Unauthorised fishing in the mud pond adjacent to the reservoir is not permitted.
- (c) Loose feeding maggots, pinkies, squats, castors and worms are allowed to a maximum of 2 pints in total per angler per day. Loose feeding particle baits is allowed to a maximum of ½ pint or 400 grams of boilies in total per angler per day.
- (d) Ground baiting is allowed to a maximum of 3 kilo bag per angler per day.
- (e) Bait binders, namely Stickymag, Grey Leam and Damp Leam is allowed to a maximum of ½ kilo per angler per day.
- (f) Members are requested to park alongside the mud pond; on the road below the dam, or by the gate at the dam wall end to a maximum of 6 vehicles.
- (g) Access to the reservoir is through the gate at the dam wall end, the main gate and the entrances at the shallow end and below the dam wall. Do not climb over the fence.

## TROUT ANGLING RULES

40. No fish are to be retained in keep-nets or carp sacks on recognised trout fishing waters, unless otherwise directed by the Committee.
41. If arriving at a reservoir by vehicle all anglers will park in the car parks provided for the general public. Do not park on the slip road at Queens Valley as this is used as emergency access and by Jersey Water employees only. Designated disabled drivers only to use the special car park provided at Queens Valley.
42. The catch and release rules are:-
- a) single fly only, no tandem ,point fly or droppers
  - b) barbless or crushed barbs only
  - c) if you decide to keep your limit of four fish you must stop fishing
  - d) deep hooked or bleeding fish must be taken as part of the four fish limit
  - e) net all fish carefully ,minimise handling and return as quickly as possible
  - f) use of de-hookers are recommended
43. Fishing is permitted only between one hour before sunrise and one hour after sunset throughout the season.

44. Fishing is by artificial fly only, cast in the conventional style.

It is strictly not permitted to:-

- (i) Use artificial aids to casting.
  - (ii) Troll in any form from the boats.
  - (iii) Loose feed from either the boats or the banks.
- 45.. Fishing from the dams or any structure is forbidden, with the exception of the pontoon at Queens Valley.
- 46.. The permit will be withdrawn if any of the above conditions are contravened.

Fishing is not permitted in any of the Silt Ponds.

#### 47. RECORDING

Where recording systems are in place for boat and/or bank anglers members must complete the relevant forms and place them in the huts/boxes provided.

The record cards provided at the end of the season must be returned. Failure to do so could result in your permit not being re-issued.

48. Holders should carry their permit card whenever on Jersey Water property with the intention of fishing.
49. The angler's huts are provided for permit holder's use. Please treat them kindly and leave them tidy and locked if no other angler is there and using it.

50. All gates used by members of the Association are to be kept locked at all times.
51. As larger fish now being stocked and in order to avoid leaving flies in fish, it is recommended that monofilament line finer than 5lb breaking strain should not be used.
52. Boats have been made available for permit holders. If the boats are numbered the number of the boat must be put in the book.
53. Failure to do so will result in a £5 fine to be donated to the angling charity of the Committees choice.

You must sign the book before you take a boat out.

54. Boats must be returned to the moorings in a tidy and bailed state. The manner of mooring must be as stated in the relevant fishing hut.  
(This may change at times due to water levels)
55. Boats will be moored at the moorings and the oars will be kept at the fisherman's' huts. When they are available, the boats may be used without charge on a first-come-first-served basis. The boats must be returned to the moorings after use and the oars put in the box provided.
56. Fisherman and companions must at all times wear a buoyancy aid in the boat.  
(These are not provided by the Jersey Water).

57. Boat anglers must keep clear of anglers fishing from the banks.
58. It is emphasised that boats are used entirely at members' own risk. The boats are the property of Jersey Water who has first call on them if they are required for maintenance work.
59. Junior members aged 14 years and over may fish unaccompanied only at the discretion of the Committee

## **COMPETITION RULES**

60. All competitions held on Association waters shall be organised by the Committee.
61. Competitors will fish within one yard to the left or right of a peg number selected in the draw and within touching distance of the bank.
62. Competitors may only draw one peg number which is not transferable.
63. Competitors may plumb the depth and set floats prior to the start of the match.
64. A competitor may only fish with one rod, one line, one hook at a time (no multiple hooks), but may have other rods set up ready to use.

65. No fly fishing, spinning, live or dead baiting is allowed.
66. Fish caught will be retained in a keep-net of size acceptable under Association Rules.
67. Competitors must not cast into another competitors swim.
68. Competitors must land their own fish, except in junior matches.
69. Competitors leaving peg positions during a match must withdraw rod and line from the water.
70. When the signal to end the match is given all lines must be removed from the water. A fish hooked before the signal may be played and landed up to a limit of 15 minutes after the signal.
71. Unless stated by the organisers, catches must remain in keep-nets at peg positions until weighed by match officials.
72. Dead fish will not be eligible for weighing-in.
73. Catches will be weighed on the Association scales and weight recorded by match officials.
74. Competitors will check that the correct weight of their catch is recorded.

In the event of any dispute the match organisers' decision

will be final

75. All live fish will be carefully returned to the water after weighing.
76. No litter should be left on the banks, surrounds to the fishery, or car park.
77. Where these rules are silent the match organisers' decision will be final.
78. Anglers may not fish for another person

For match fishing purposes only, juniors consist of all those persons who have not attained the age of 17 years at the start of the recognised coarse fishing season.

Do not play transistor radios or cassettes.

Do not interfere with others fishing.

Handle any fish caught with care.

Always park in the car parks provided.
